

Norm attended the Monday night session, which was mainly an outline of what the sessions were going to cover. All of us had a chance to introduce ourselves, who we represented, and why we were interested in coming to these sessions.

Tuesday morning Judy and Verne were also in attendance. Judy had a chance to add to what I had indicated that we were interested in—sites for low-income housing. The team that was leading the sessions gave examples of areas and communities where they had gone in and helped revitalize those areas. There was much talk about the Kellogg and Government Gulch areas of the Valley. We came away from the meeting with the feeling that maybe there would be some benefit to the Fuller Center for Housing in the future, but not too much help for us in the short term.
