Excerpts of a note sent from Denny Brown with the egg: "For years I've read in the Bulletin about all your craft sales and raffles with the intention of sending you something, but the sale/raffle dates were always too close for me to meet. This is a jewel box made from an actual goose egg. The shell is strengthened by coating the inside with an epoxy type coating, so the finished egg is not real fragile - no more than a dish would be. There are not a lot of them made around here although we saw many when traveling in Russia. We were told that in that area it was customary to gift decorated eggs on special occasions."
