The Mullan Site

Last year's results of the soil testing on our Dewey Street project were fine except for the driveway. The driveway drained toward the house and was against the lower part of the siding. As a result, the lower part of the siding was decomposing and the laundry room floor needed to be replaced. Prior to remediation, I requested that they slope the driveway away from the house during remediation. Instead, they just simply replaced the top layer of gravel leaving the slope and height of the driveway the same! Although I complained, they would not redo the driveway. Now before residing the house, we're going to have to redo the driveway ourselves, which I don't mind doing so much as having seen our tax monies wasted on this project.

The Little Shop

By the time you read this newsletter, the "Little Shop" building will have been moved to a more noticeable location near Furniture Exchange. The following items are our general guidelines:

- I. **NEED:** To qualify you must have housing need. For example:
No indoor plumbing, poor heating, leaks in roof, overcrowding (three to a bedroom), unsafe or unsanitary conditions; excessive amount of income spent on housing (over 30% of your gross income).
- II. **ABILITY TO PAY:** You need to have a minimum steady income of \$1300 a month.
Long term debt limitations no more than 40% of income: Long term debt is any debt that takes over 10 months to pay off, such as house payments, car payments, credit card debt, child support payments, alimony payments, education debt, etc.
- III. **WILLINGNESS TO PARTNER:** If you are approved for a FCH home, we ask that you be willing to join in programs to learn and practice budgeting, home repair, maintenance and attend regular partnering meetings. We ask that your family be willing to participate in the publicity that goes along with being selected for a FCH home.

If you are approved, we ask that you be willing to work 500 hours (or 250 for single head of household) "sweat equity" on construction on your and other families' home. Each partner family must provide a least one person which will work at least six (6) hours one day a week unless excused by the construction supervisor. If the partner fails its six (6) hours per week obligation on the job site five times prior to their house completion, then the Partnership/Construction Committee shall recommend to the Board to deselect the family. If approved, your family is responsible for a down payment of \$200 or one percent of the cost of the home, whichever is less.

If you are interested in Silver Valley Fuller Center for Housing and believe you qualify for a home according to the above guidelines, we encourage you to contact us and ask for an application. All information is considered confidential and is to be used only for family selection. *We are willing to help you fill out the application.* If you have any questions, please call Marilyn White, Chairperson for the Family Selection committee.
