#### Ride the Wall

We hoped to have the registration for this event finished so it could be included in this issue. However, we are still negotiating for the insurance we need before using the Trail of the Coeur d'Alenes between Enaville (where The Snake Pit is) and Cataldo where the riders turn off to cross the bridge to the CCC &Wall Ridge Road.

Our insurance must cover the liability of both the Idaho Parks Department which is in charge of the bike trail and of the Coeur d'Alene Tribe which owns the land that the trail is on.

Since the insurance takes a big chunk of our registration fees, we are hoping to set up a separate account just to pay for the insurance. Last year it was over \$400. If you would like to contribute to cover this cost, please note "Ride Insurance Fund" on your donation.

Since the Ride the Wall will be June 21 on a Friday, Tom Richards at The Snake Pit is planning on having a special event with live music. More about this will be in future issues of The Silver Bulletin.

When the registration form is finished, it will be on the web (www.svfch.org), in the next newsletter, and as handouts. You will also be able to register online as you did last year.






