

### Nancy Elliott's Stairs

IN THE BEGINNING, there was a very dilapidated stairway with invasive roots from a tall dangerously rotten tree. Thanks to AVISTA, the tree was skillfully removed without damaging anyone or anything. (Yeh!)

THEN, I dug (& dug) and sawed (& sawed) the tree roots out.

THEN, the workers, John Delaney, Jared Kitchen, CJ Leetch dug (& dug) postholes until the posthole diggers had to be repaired.

THEN, the posthole diggers were repaired "overnight", at "no charge" by Mike's Specialty Welding with "steel handles".

THEN, under Rick Gilbert's carefully measured & calculated plans, the workers dug (& dug); mixed concrete, packed concrete in buckets up the steep hillside' set posts in concrete; leveled out the old landing; nailed the stringers onto the posts and to the house; nailed on the treads & risers; and attached the graspable handrails.

NOW: Nancy Elliot has pressure treated stairs set in extra strength concrete; a level landing; eleven inch treads; seven & one half inch risers; and a graspable handrail on both sides.

THANKS, everyone, including a city that's easy to work with and wise advice from building inspector, Dale Magnus. It's GREAT when a community works together.

PS: All materials were obtained locally: pressure treated wood and extra strength concrete from Kellogg Lumber Company and cement and concrete mix from Building Maintenance & Supply.

### Need

## Debra Bornitz's Roof

Debbie Bornitz lives in a manufactured home by Bentley Creek in Kootenai County. In heavy runoff years, Bentley Creek floods some of the properties adjacent to the creek. Debra has wisely placed her home high enough above flood level and has papers from the county to confirm that fact. [When we helped the Otto's with their home on Fern Creek, we had to have a surveyor establish their elevation before we could update their home as needed.] However, every time it snowed much, Debbie had to shovel the snow off the roof before it became too heavy—enough to endanger it. The trusses on her manufactured home are quite small. When her old roof started leaking, we took on the task of replacing it.

Rick Wood (a very helpful neighbor) felt a metal roof would be much better than replacing the roof with an asphalt one. He was right, of course, as it would help remove the weight of the snow in winter.

Although Clint Kunze had crews of youth Servant Adventurers from Shoshone Mountain Retreat available to help, the extreme heat and then smoke plus the fear of too much weight on the roof of a large crew eliminated them. So this fall we hired Bogie and Sons to install a metal roof after we removed the asphalt shingles. (Bogie & Sons had roofed two of our first homes—the Lane and Otto homes for us.) Steve Bougard placed his dumpster along side of the house where Rick Wood, his wife, Shannon, John “Boy” Delaney, and I threw all the old shingles in it.

Now that the roof is on, we have the porch entry to contend with. We will place a gutter on the fascia above the entry door, diverting the water from the roof to the left of the porch. Next spring we intend to replace the wooden porch with a concrete one.


