With the efforts of the participants and their sponsors and the raffle, we now have \$1991 to help others.







John Boy Delaney returned with Verne & Kathy to harvest the metal. He took the photos below.







first elimination group for the sale. However, after going through the whole process with help from Brian Dale with HUD in Boise and various agents at the FHA Resource center, we received the following request:



"Please send a list of at least 5 addresses of homes that your nonprofit has purchased, rehabbed and sold to low or moderate income buyers. To qualify the homes must have been purchased in the name of

your nonprofit, and recorded by the County in the name of your nonprofit. The homes must have been purchased within any 2 year time frame within the last 5 years."

We don't qualify since we have not dedicated 5 homes within their time frame—we have 4 but not within a 2 year period. We did leave a bid she could afford in open bidding but guess it will be too low.
