Global Home Challenge Results

This home in Haiti is one of the 80 homes being built with funds raised with the Global Home Challenge.

Meet the Family Rosena (50) is a widow who lost her husband Caleme Jean in 2016 and continues to raise her three children Rolin (17), Gina (13), and Darlie (7), who are all still in school as she values their education. She now

sells fruits and vegetables in the market of Pignon, where she earns enough to provide the basics for her family and pay the loan for her Fuller Center home, but could never afford a loan from a bank. She was able to save up and purchase a small piece of land to build a home for her family. Upon completing her home,

Rosena said, "I will keep praying for Fuller Center For Housing so that they can keep up the good work and continue to change people's life as they do for me, and I feel like I will live longer with no more worries for rainy times and no more dust in my floor." Haiti has long been the poorest country in the western hemisphere, where formal jobs are few as families remain stuck in survival mode. We are working in the northern city of Pignon.

Global Home Challenge Wrap-Up

As you know from previous newsletters "Team Silver Valley Idaho" (consisting of Ellie Arguimbau, Judy and Verne Blalack, and their son and daughter- in- law, George and Melody Blalack) participated in the Global Home Challenge.

The Fuller Center International was not able to do global building projects this summer due to the corona virus and also was not able to do their annual crosscountry bike rides. The International office in Americus, Georgia, came up with the idea of a "Virtual Around the World in 80 Days" tour. A list of the countries visited virtually were El Salvador, Venezuela, Haiti, Puerto Rico, Peru, Chile, New Guinea, the Philippines, Thailand, Nepal, Sri Lanka, India, Madagascar, South Africa, Congo, Nigeria, Ghana, Sierra Leone, and Armenia.

The goal was to log **50,000** miles by bike, foot, swimming etc. and to raise **\$200,000** to build **80** houses in these and other countries. The 110 participants in the virtual tour easily surpassed the 50,000 miles goal

(74,200) but had a little more difficulty reaching the \$200,000 donation goal. However in the last 3 weeks there was a huge outpouring of donations encouraged by matches by 2 very generous people. The total raised is **\$230,268** and still counting. We want to thank all the people who contributed to our success. It was a fun and very satisfying event.


