Community Collaboration Tackles Pest Control Challenges

In a remarkable display of partnership and community spirit, the Silver Valley Fuller Center for Housing and the Pinehurst Lions Club have joined forces to support the *Silver Valley CARES Community Pest Control Fund.* This initiative addresses a pressing need for financial assistance for effective pest control solutions, particularly for people without the financial resources to tackle bedbug infestations, helping families and individuals maintain safe and healthy living environments.

The Silver Valley CARES Community Pest Control Fund provides financial assistance to those who may struggle to afford critical pest management services. This effort is particularly vital to address the needs of families and individuals without financial resources before issues spread, spiral out of control, or cause public health concerns and mental stress. Infestations can escalate quickly, impacting the health of residents and placing unnecessary strain on communities. By addressing these challenges head-on, the program ensures that homes remain livable and free of harmful pests.

Silver Valley CARES, a community mental health advocacy group, plays a crucial role in fostering these efforts. By providing support that reduces the stress and anguish

caused by unresolved pest issues, the organization upholds its mission of promoting mental health and well-being in the community.

This initiative began when Siobhan Curet, a member of Silver Valley CARES as well as a member of the Fuller Center board, approached the Fuller Center about the issue. Recognizing the importance of the cause, the Fuller Center board held a unanimous vote to donate to the fund. Following the vote, Bob Whitman, President of the Fuller Center board, asked Siobhan to stay and announced that the Fuller Center would challenge the Pinehurst Lions Club to match their donation.


