The Fuller Center for Housing, while primarily engaged in helping poor families into decent homes, also does a good deal of disaster recovery work. Our Disaster ReBuilders division has been restoring homes and hope in the aftermath of tornadoes, floods and hurricanes for many years. We have worked in Louisiana, Texas,



After Hurricane Helene came ashore in Florida on September 26, 2024, it raced through western North Carolina dumping torrential rainfall. The result was devastating flooding and mudslides. We are housing volunteers at Cragmont Assembly, Black Mountain, with a second location at Calvary Church, Asheville, as we begin to assist the community in rebuilding. and Florida and are currently hard at work in North Carolina and Georgia in the wake of Hurricane Helene where they are focusing on rural communities since they are less likely to have insurance. Additionally, our New York City covenant partner, through their DART ((Disaster Assistance Response Team), has helped many families recover from flood damage and other storm related losses. Both of these programs rely heavily on volunteer support.

Interestingly, it was Hurricane Katrina that got Millard Fuller and The Fuller Center into building houses as we were not originally established as a building ministry. Katrina sent hundreds of families fleeing northward, many ending up in Shreveport. We were asked to come in and help with the resettlement of these families and from that The Fuller Center as we know it today was born. So disaster work has been a part of The Fuller Center's work since the earliest days.

What is the Fuller Center for Housing?

The Fuller Center for Housing, faith-driven and Christ-centered, promotes collaborative and innovative partnerships with individuals and organizations in an unrelenting quest to provide adequate shelter for all people in need worldwide.

The Fuller Center creates partnerships within communities that bring together churches, schools, businesses and civic organizations to build decent, affordable homes in partnership with people who are unable to secure adequate housing by conventional means.

The Fuller Center works in collaboration with our covenant partners, other service-oriented organizations and countless volunteers to build and repair homes. All homeowners work hand-in-hand with volunteers to build their own homes, which are then sold to them on terms they can afford, based on the Biblical idea of no-profit, no-interest loans.

With some smaller renovation projects, an innovative payment program called The Greater Blessing Program is utilized, whereby recipients promise to repay the loan amount without signing an actual mortgage agreement. They decide the monthly amount they can afford to repay and the period of time that it will take to repay the cost of repairs. There is no legal obligation to repay these loans. It is a leap of faith in the basic goodness of humankind and is proving to be very successful.

We are committed to good stewardship and work hard to keep our administrative costs low and to select our recipient families wisely. This helps to ensure that the vast majority of your tax-deductible gifts go toward building and repairing homes for those in need.
