### The Greater Blessings Program - One Family, One Community, One Blessing!

John Bourque actively and warmly heads the Greater Blessings Program through the Silver Valley Fuller Center for Housing, of which John and myself are board members.

This past year John has taken on trying to help make a difference for families in the Silver Valley. I'm trying to be his partner in crime! So, when he saw a need for a fellow co-worker and her husband, he felt it would be the perfect opportunity to help them with a very necessary and big project.

John drives a special needs bus for the Kellogg School District and his Bus Aid, Tammy Claflin and her husband, Carl had a serious and dangerously collapsing front entry porch. Carl was battling terminal cancer and so very sadly lost his fight late this summer. However, not before he saw that the project that John encouraged Tammy to submit an application for was completed.

John received Tammy and Carl's application mid-April. Just In time to be able to John Borque and Geri Cochrane make the necessary preparations for this important project to happen. This is a good moment to share with you, the community how, that It takes time to make a project like this come together. That the Silver Valley Fuller Center For Housing & The Greater Blessings Program are manned by many volunteers. Although some Board Members are retired, many have full-time jobs, families, and busy lives. The volunteers working behind

the scenes for the SVFCH and Greater Blessings programs often have limited time, which can result in certain tasks taking longer to complete. However, their dedication is what ultimately makes these community projects possible.

Tammy and Carl's Greater Blessing application then needed to be taken to the next SVFCH monthly board meeting to be approved. Now it was time to roll up everyone's sleeves! Board members Frank Culhno, Bob Whitman, John and I met at the Claflin's home to see what materials would be needed and to make a gameplan to get the project started.

All of this was just in time to be able to utilize the Fuller Center Bicycle Adventurers to be able to help with this undertaking. There were thirty-one volunteer bikers that cycled from Seattle to Washington DC from May 21st to August 4<sup>th</sup> - a 4,000-mile journey across the nation, helping many communities and families such as the Claflin's. Stopping in Kellogg along the way!

But there are many more people to thank and acknowledge for their time and commitment to make projects like this happen. John went to the Kellogg School district to ask if they could let the Bikers stay at the old Kellogg

Middle School gym, while they were here working. What a perfect place for them to stay! There were also many coworkers from the Transportation Department who donated money to help with the purchase of all the building supplies for Tammy & Carl's porch. The Silver Valley Fuller Center just can't thank the community enough for all of their time and commitment to that weekend. It took the many churches and community businesses donations and sponsors to make this happen!

The Fuller Center Bicycle Adventurers rode into Kellogg, Thursday, May 30<sup>th</sup> They split up into various groups to help with the few community projects that the SVFCH had going on spreading out from Mullan, to Osburn to Kellogg. There were several men from the Biker's group that helped to get Tammy and Carl's front porch started. They worked specifically to rebuild the dilapidated and partially collapsed flooring of the porch to be reinforced and safe again.

It now took John and myself through mid-July to finish the interior of the porch. John and I would work in the mornings to beat the intense heat of the day. We could only go a few days a week and or a day on the weekend to try to finish the porch. The porch repair included replacing the sheet rock and windows, installing vinyl flooring,

painting, finish work, and installing a new screen door. In mid-July, Ray Guthmiller, another SVFCH board member, enthusiastically volunteered to help us reframe and install the screen door. A few days later, John and I went back to do the final clean and touch ups of the porch. The following day, July 20th, Carl lost his fight with cancer. I would like to think that Carl was watching over us!

There were many days that Carl was able to come out and have great conversations with us and watch the progress we were making. I only wish that I thought to take a picture of Carl and Tammy before we lost him. However, I know that Tammy's wood shed is full, and the porch is completed and safe. What a wonderful community we live in!

So far in 2024 besides Tammy & Carl's porch the Greater Blessings
Program has helped families with emergency/frozen water pipes, a broken
water line, installed a privacy fence and are now helping an applicant in
Wallace work with a contractor make her chimney safe so she can use a
wood stove to reduce her winter heating cost. Remember all of this is done
with local contractors and volunteers!

The Fuller Center Greater Blessings Program repairs or renovates homes with a cap of \$5,000.00 The beneficiary of those repairs has an opportunity to repay the cost of those repairs over time on terms that they can afford,

without a loan agreement. Re-donation payments are made monthly, providing a beneficiary the opportunity of receiving a Greater Blessing of giving, not just receiving.

As we reflect on the success of projects like Tammy and Carl's porch, we are reminded that none of this would be possible without the dedication and hard work of our volunteers. However, the need for helping hands is ongoing. The Silver Valley Fuller Center for Housing is actively seeking volunteers to assist in several crucial areas.

We are in need of someone to help manage and revamp our website, moving it to a more user-friendly platform. This is a vital role, as an accessible and engaging online presence allows us to reach more people, including those in need and those who want to help. If you have skills in website design or management, we would greatly appreciate your assistance.

In addition, we are always looking for more construction supervisors and volunteers. Whether you have extensive experience or are simply willing to lend a hand, your time
